A quick update on DRXC happenings.

<u>Trail Conditions</u> All the trails are now open and in use. On the Silver Spoon Trails the groomers have the trails in great shape. Thanks groomers! The snow coverage on the Bass Lake Trails is thin in some spots, so you may nick a rock or two during your travels.



<u>Silver Spoon Ski (and Snowshoe) Fest</u> Just a reminder that the (virtual) Silver Spoon has started. It's not too late to join and submit your kilometres retroactively! Raise money for the Four Seasons Conservancy while you ski or snowshoe. Here's the process:

- 1. Sign up for free on Zone4.
- 2. Starting with Saturday January 29, keep track of kilometres and trails that you're skiing/snowshoeing.
- 3. On a regular basis (perhaps daily), submit your tally using an easy online form.
- 4. Repeat until Sunday February 6.
- 5. Congratulate yourself on your accomplishment.

You can count any trail in the Ottawa Valley between Driftwood Provincial Park in the west and the Petawawa Research Forest in the east.
